So far this year we have approved funding for: \$3,000 for the library for purchase of books and other materials; the purchase of new sewing machines for the FACS classroom; designating the use of PTA funds from last year for the purchase of 20 new computers for the library; CJSF field trip to CSULB; \$100 classroom grants to teachers who are PTA members; Robotics Club; Jazz Band; participation in Scripps Spelling Bee; Reflections Art program; defibrillator battery in nurse's office; Scholastic educational magazines for language arts, history, science and art; and many other programs.
